I will not delve into the operation of the RALLY SAFE units only to direct you to Google its operation and capabilities.

In a few words, the units transmit various information, location, speed, G forces if excessive and if involved in an incident are a few.

Just like bad counterfeit bank notes, which all have the same serial number, so is the tracking number provided in this scam. FYI, the problem number is #CS279003594DE and it's used in emails and texts so be warned. Be wary of all requests out of the ordinary. While typing this I just answered the phone to a recorded message advising me my Private Amazon account was being suspended. Obviously, I just hung up straight away, it was an easy decision as I don't have an Amazon account, private or otherwise and yesterday I had a new one, to me anyway, it was the ATO threatening to suspend my Group tax file, my what? I'm aware of a tax file number but a group Tax File?? Many scams involve the passing of account numbers to supposedly confirm ownership of the account but all that is happening is the unwitting exposure of info the scammers now have but didn't really have before and they can now start cleaning out bank accounts, a little at a time. Small insignificant amounts are less likely to be flagged as suspicious by the bank staff and software but it doesn't take too many of these small amounts to make one scammer very wealthy. Thus with dollar signs in their eyes, there are thousands of these wankers, all trying different ways to relieve you of your hard-earned moolah.

Be careful and question any request that you are not sure about.

SEAFOOD PLATTER

Cooked prawns, oysters, cooked lobster tails and smoked salmon
Lime wedge and fresh parsley to garnish

Cocktail dip

½ cup mayonnaise	¼ cup thickened cream
2 tblspns tomato sauce	2 tsp Worcestershire sauce
2 tsp lemon juice	¼ tsp cracked black pepper

Tartare dip

¾ cup mayonnaise	2 tblspns drained chopped capers
2 tblspns chopped gherkins	1 tblspn chopped fresh parsley
½ tsp finely grated lemon rind	

Method: - Cocktail dip. Combine all ingredients in a small bowl; mix well.

Tartare dip. Combine all ingredients in a small bowl; mix well

Arrange seafood on a large platter. Serve with Cocktail and Tartare dips; garnish with lime wedge and fresh parsley.

FROZEN FRUIT PUDDING

1 litre strawberry ice-cream	½ cup finely chopped raisins
¼ cup finely chopped glace peaches	2 tblspns chopped glace cherries
¼ cup sultanas	1 tsp finely grated orange rind
1 tblspn orange juice	25g butter, chopped
1 tblspn brown sugar	2 tblspns brandy
2 litres vanilla ice-cream	¼ cup chopped hazelnuts, toasted
100g white chocolate, finely chopped	Strawberries to decorate

Method: - Grease a 2.25 litre pudding basin (9-cup capacity) and line with plastic wrap.

Spoon slightly softened strawberry ice-cream into prepared basin and spread over base and up side. Cover and freeze until firm.

Combine fruit, rind, juice, butter, sugar and brandy in a pan; stir over low heat until sugar dissolves. Simmer for two minutes or until fruit is plump; cool.

Beat vanilla ice-cream with an electric mixer until smooth. Stir in the fruit mixture, hazelnuts and chocolate. Pour mixture into basin over the strawberry layer. Cover and freeze until firm.

To serve, turn out onto a serving plate and decorate with strawberries.

WHITE CHRISTMAS

4 cups Rice Bubbles
¾ cup icing sugar mixture
½ cup full-cream milk powder
Coloured cachous, rainbow choc-chips, extra sifted icing sugar mixture.
12 small terracotta pots and thin red ribbon to decorate.

1 cup desiccated coconut
1 x 250g block coha, melted
200g white chocolate, melted

Method: - Grease two oven trays and line with non-stick baking paper. Combine Rice Bubbles, coconut, icing sugar, coha, milk powder and half the melted chocolate in a large bowl; mix well. Spoon mixture into metal cone-shaped moulds (half-cup capacity). Place cones, base-side down, onto oven trays and refrigerate until set.

Unmould chocolate crackle mixture from cones. Spoon re-melted remaining chocolate into a small paper piping bag. Pipe small dots of chocolate onto the trees and secure on cachous and rainbow choc-chips in a decorative pattern.

Pipe 24 small chocolate star-shapes onto non-stick baking paper and place a cachou in the center of each star, allow to set. Secure two stars back to back on top of the trees with a little melted chocolate. Dust the trees with a little sifted icing sugar.

Place them in the terracotta pots and decorate with ribbon.

MINI MERINGUE TARTS

1½ cups plain flour
1 egg yolk
2 tsp orange juice

125g butter, chopped
1 tsp finely grated orange rind
2-3 tsp water

Topping

2 egg whites
½ x 410g jar fruit mince

½ cup caster sugar

Method: - Grease a 12 hole shallow patty pan.

Process flour and butter until combined. Add egg yolk, rind, juice and enough water to make a soft dough. Shape dough on a lightly floured surface into a ball. Cover and refrigerate for 30 minutes, or until firm.

Roll pastry between non-stick baking paper until 5mm thick. Cut into 12 x 7cm rounds. Press into holes of prepared pan. Lightly prick bases with a fork.

Cook in a moderate oven, 180°C. for 15 minutes, or until lightly browned.

Topping

Beat egg-whites in a small bowl with an electric mixer until soft peaks form.

Gradually add sugar, beating well between additions until dissolved.

Place two teaspoons of the fruit mince into each pastry case; top with a heaped teaspoon of Topping.

Cook under a hot grill until top is lightly browned.

CHOC-STRAWBERRY CONE

4 x 250g punnets strawberries
250g dark chocolate, melted

250g white chocolate, melted
Ivy leaves to decorate

Method: - Grease three oven trays and line them with non-stick baking paper.

Holding the unhulled strawberries from the top, dip them one at a time three quarters of the way into the melted white chocolate. Place on prepared trays and allow to set.

Again holding from the top, dip the white chocolate-coated strawberries into the melted dark chocolate, about two-thirds of the way down, leaving a 1cm of white chocolate showing. Place onto the prepared trays and allow the strawberries to set.

Secure the strawberries with toothpicks around a polystyrene cone (available from craft shops) covered in foil. Refrigerate until it's time to serve.

Decorate with ivy leaves.

3 QUICK SAVOURIES

Slice a French stick into 2cm thick slices. Place onto oven trays, toast until lightly browned. Top with sliced cherry tomatoes, bocconcini cheese and basil leaves. Drizzle with a little olive oil combined with crushed garlic.

Heat mini vol-au-vent cases on an oven tray in a moderate oven, 180°C, until crisp. Fill with combined salmon, light sour cream, grated lemon rind, lemon juice, chopped fresh dill salt and pepper to taste. Garnish with extra lemon rind and dill.

Shell and devein cooked prawns, leaving tails intact. Brush with a little bottled roasted capsicum pesto; wrap with thinly sliced trimmed bacon rashers. Thread onto small skewers, place on an oven tray. Grill until bacon is slightly crisp.

GOURMET SALAD

1 kg baby new potatoes, halved	2 tblspn olive oil
200g button mushrooms, halved	2 bunches asparagus, halved
1 baby cos lettuce	1 avocado, sliced
100g baby spinach leaves	

Dressing

¼ cup lemon juice	1 clove garlic, crushed
2 tblspns white wine vinegar	1 tsp sugar
1 tblspn chopped fresh parsley	¾ cup olive oil

Method: - Place potatoes and oil in a baking dish. Cook in a hot oven, 240°C, for 45 minutes. Add mushrooms, cook 10 minutes or until mushrooms are soft and potatoes are browned.

Cook asparagus until tender. Rinse under cold water and drain well.

Dressing

Combine ingredients in a screw-top jar and shake well.

Combine potatoes, mushrooms, asparagus, torn lettuce leaves, avocado and spinach leaves in a large bowl and mix well. Arrange on a platter or individual plates and drizzle with Dressing just before serving.

CRUNCHY BAKED POTATOES

10 large potatoes
50g butter, melted

¼ cup oil

Hot and spicy seasoning

2 tsp hot paprika
1 tsp cracked black pepper

1 tsp ground cumin
1 tsp salt

Garlic seasoning

2 tsp chicken stock powder

2 tsp garlic salt

Method: - Halve peeled potatoes. Heat oil in a large baking dish on top of the stove and add potatoes. Cook, turning occasionally, for five minutes. Arrange the potatoes in the dish, base-side down, and brush all over the butter.

Cook, uncovered, in a moderate oven, 180°C, for 40 minutes.

Hot and spicy seasoning.

Combine all ingredients in a small bowl; mix well.

Garlic seasoning

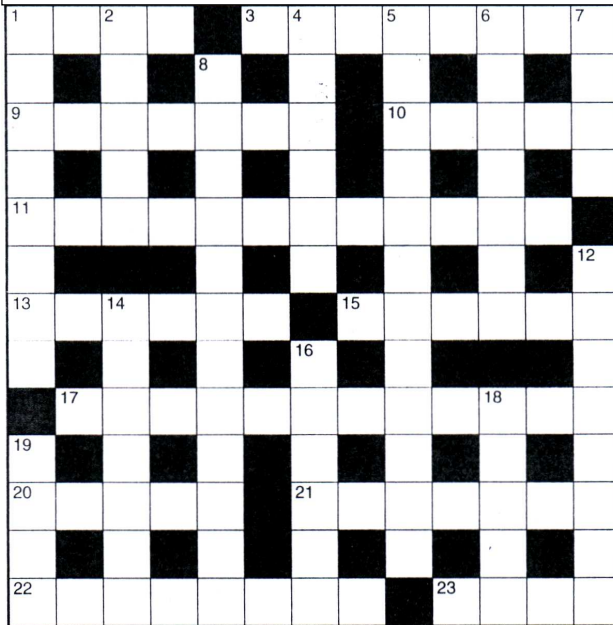
Combine all ingredients in a small bowl; mix well.
